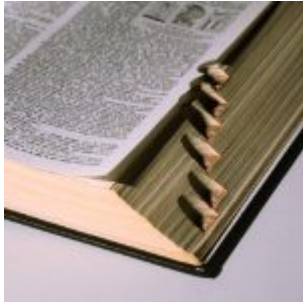


How do you describe a decision?
